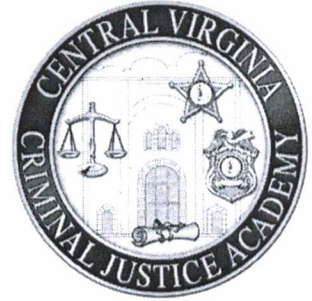

Title: Lieutenants, Corporals & Sergeants: The Foundation of Jail Supervision -(16 hours)

Target Audience: newly promoted or veteran jail corporals, lieutenants, sergeants or section supervisors.

Course Description: When a line correctional officer (CO) is promoted to a supervisory position of lieutenant, corporal or sergeant, two things change. First, the direction of his or her career changes; the journey begins of promotions and taking on of more responsibilities. The second is more personal-the new supervisor now has to order, direct, evaluate and discipline the officers that he or she once “shared the trenches” with. This may cause anxiety and stress. The “crossing over” to supervisory rank means that more is expected of the new supervisor. This two-day seminar will discuss how corporals, sergeants, lieutenants and section supervisors can help build a foundation of good staffing and operations in the jail-by bringing out the best in themselves and also the best in their subordinates. The trainees will receive good advice in how to do their best, and using real cases-how to avoid doing their worst, including ending up in court. Day 1 will discuss the correctional workforce, characteristics of good leaders and bringing out the best in the line staff. Day 2 will focus on handling problems and avoiding liability.
